Faulty BMTC website icks students

luru: Students are venting against the Bengaluru Metropolitan Transport Corporation (BMTC) because of an 'error' on the website to apply for a student pass. This is happening now when most of the colleges in Bengaluru are starting their academic year. Anil Budur Lulla took to the social media platform 'X' on July 15 and tweeted his views, tagging BMTC. "Looks like @BMTC BEN-GALURU is trying to mop up ticket revenue from college boys. Thousands of college kids cannot apply for student passes because of a 'system error'. Forced to buy monthly passes at Rs 1050 and weekly Rs 300 passes (ordinary) for regular earning men." Shaheen Shasa, a member of Bengaluru Bus Praynikara Vedike, speaking to The Beacon, said, "BMTC, being a government body, must ensure its smooth online application process as it is one of the most used platforms students use to apply for the bus pass". Shasa added, "Just like the government starts preparing for the monsoon by clearing drains and repairing roads, it should also keep the online portals running during the time of the year when the admissions start and students start applying for yearly student passes." She also highlighted that not just female students but even male students must be allowed to trav-

lthough unemployment continues to be a major **L**issue in the country and rightly became one of the central poll planks of several opposition parties during the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, the Central government denies it to be a persisting BJP ministers, challenge. including Prime Minister Narendra Modi, have been quoting the RBI's KLEM (Capital, Labour, Energy, Material, and Services) data that 4.7 crore jobs were created in the fiscal year 2024. Modi mentioned at an event in Mumbai that the BJP-led government, through its various schemes of skill development and employment, has created eight crore jobs in the last three or four years and has silenced those spreading fake news and narratives about unemployment in the country. from 46.8% in 2017-18 to 56% in 2022-23, indicating a jump in the employment figures. Similarly, labour force participation has also increased in the country, from 49.8% in 2017-18 to 57.9% in 2022–23. The unemployment rate has declined from 6.0% in 2017-18 to a low of 3.2% in 2022-23.

However, CMIE survey data depict a stark unemployment problem in the country. According to CMIE (Consumer Household Pyramids Survey), the unemployment rate in India sharply rose to 9.2 per cent in June 2024 from 7 per cent in May 2024.

Another Citi Group report estimates that only 21 per cent of rural India has a salaried job, which is lower than the pre-COVID rate, which stood at 24 per cent. The report also further estimates that real wages in rural India are decreasing by 1-1.5 per cent.
